The class has been engaging in prayer meditation sessions after recess to promote mindfulness and inner peace. The goal of these sessions is to help the students focus, be still, and cultivate a sense of calm while engaging in quiet prayer.

Each day, the children collaboratively set up the prayer circle, and they take turns to signal the start of the meditation and to read the chosen prayer for the class. These sessions provide a valuable opportunity for the students to reflect and connect with their inner selves.

Additionally, the children have been encouraged to write about their experiences with prayer meditation and share how it makes them feel. This practice not only fosters a sense of community and spiritual awareness but also helps the students develop important skills for self-reflection and emotional well-being.
